

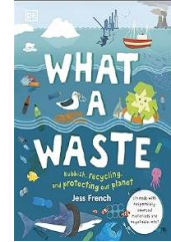
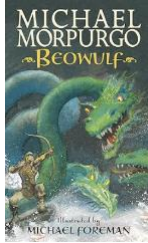
Termly Learning Leaflet

Reading

Reading is exceptionally important and it is imperative that children are reading regularly, hopefully for 10 – 15 minutes at least 5 times per week. It would be really helpful if you could listen to your child read and record this in their home reading record. Reading records are to be returned every **Monday** morning. Children will bring a book home from school, but they are also quite welcome to read any books or magazines they have at home.

Homework Expectations at Broadway Junior School

Children will receive homework each Monday to be returned the following Monday. Homework may be set using an online platform such as Purple Mash, Sumdog or Times Tables Rock Stars. The work will be explained and discussed in class before coming home; it may be a continuation of classwork, or a task to consolidate learning. We would really appreciate your support in ensuring your child completes and returns their homework on time.

PE in Year 5

Children in Year 5 will participate in P.E on **Thursdays**, your child will need to arrive in school wearing their kit. PE lessons will take place inside and out, dependent on the weather so your child's choice of kit should reflect this. Trainers will be required for all pupils, with black tracksuit bottoms, shorts or joggers (leggings for the girls) along with their regular uniform top (or white t-shirt).

Swimming lessons will continue at Sandhill View Academy during Summer term. On the day of your child's session, they should bring swimwear, a towel and a swimming hat.

Our Curriculum in Year 5 this term...

In reading we will...
Draw inferences from reading and explain thinking, returning to the text to support opinions. Use skimming and scanning to identify language and grammar features the writer had used to create specific effects and discuss the impact on the reader. Justify opinions about texts with confidence. Deduce characters' feelings, thoughts and motives for actions.
In writing we will...
Explore characterisation through diary and letter-writing. Develop instructional writing and poetry, linked to the text Beowulf. Write a journalistic report with a wide range of presentational and organisational devices. Using the text Kensuke's Kingdom, incorporate writing in different tense, first and third person.
In mathematics we will...
Compare and order fractions and use common factors to simplify fractions. We will add and subtract fractions with different denominators and mixed numbers, using the concept of equivalent fractions. We will use knowledge of decimals and fractions to convert between units of measure. We will compare angles, estimate and measure angles in degrees and draw angles of a given size.
In science we will...
Compare materials on the basis of their properties and know that some materials will dissolve in liquid to form a solution. Using knowledge of solids, liquids and gases, we will decide how mixtures might be separated, including filtering, sieving and evaporating.
In RE we will...
Explore the beliefs: Christians and how to live: 'What would Jesus do?' and What matters most to Humanists and Christians? We will look at what this means to others and the impact this has on their lives.
In geography we will...
Study maps, and computer mapping to locate features of our local beaches and coast line. Research the continent Europe focusing on key features and capital cities.
In history we will...
Build up knowledge and a chronological understanding of the history of the local area and Roker pier and study changes over time. We will take part in an enquiry looking at the use of sites during the early 1900s and what could be expected in the future.
In music we will...
Use our voices and musical instruments to create an arrangement of a song. We will rehearse and perform with increasing accuracy.
In art we will...
Create monoprints using a range of materials. We will create paintings with backgrounds and foregrounds explaining their choices for the materials/techniques used.
In DT we will...
Research different types of bread by tasting and evaluating them. We will then design our own recipe, choosing our own ingredients before baking and evaluating our own design.
In French we will...
Learn the French vocabulary linked to my home.
In PSHE/RSHE we will...
Recognise what constitutes a positive, healthy relationship and develop the skills to form and maintain positive and healthy relationships.
In computing we will...
Learn the basics of concept mapping both individually and in collaborative working groups using 2Connect.
In PE we will...
Perform a range of skills fluently and accurately, apply a combination of skills confidently in specific contexts and link actions together so that they flow and perform a variety of movements and skills with good body tension.
