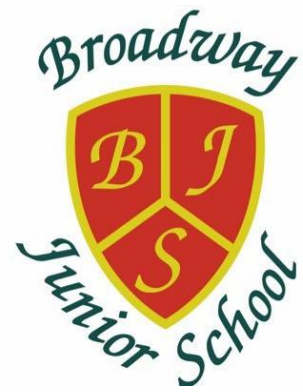


Broadway Junior School
