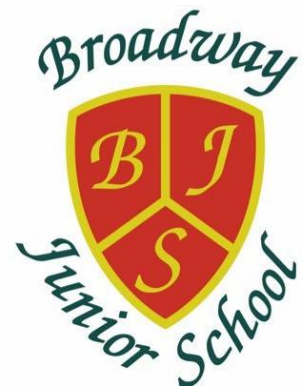


# Broadway Junior School
