School Dinners

Our school meals are balanced, healthy, nutritious and convenient for busy families too. The cost of a school meal per week is ± 12.00 (± 2.40 per day). All payments to school should be made via the online payment system, SchoolMoney. Please speak with a member of staff in the school office for support with this, if needed.

To support the admin of lunches, children's meal plans should remain the same for the entirety of the week. Please provide 7 days notice for any change to your child's meal plan.

Physical Education (PE)

The PE uniform includes a white t-shirt including their usual school jumper, black bottoms and black trainers. For ease, we request that children come to school in their PE kit on their PE days. Previously, this has also been the case for those who attend sports clubs after school too. On these days, for club children, please wear uniform as normal and bring kits in a bag. This helps us to ensure a level of consistency across the school.

In order to maintain high standards, any child who is not wearing the correct PE uniform may be provided with a clean kit from school for the day.

Uniform Reminders

It has been lovely to see everyone looking so smart and ready for their new year in school. Please be reminded that our uniform consists of a bottle green jumper/cardigan, white polo t-shirt and **PLAIN** black shoes/trainers. Children may wear black/grey trousers/skirt.

Jeans, tracksuit/jogging bottoms and leggings are <u>NOT</u> included as suitable items of school uniform.

Our uniform does not need to include branded school items as we understand the financial demand this can cause for families.

Our school has a no jewellery policy unless a simple wrist watch (For safeguarding reasons, NO smart watches, please).

Children's hairstyles should be smart, neat, tidy and compliment the school's uniform policy. Styles that cause a distraction such as: extremely short, patterned, dyed, Mohican, large bows/accessories etc. are considered to be inappropriate and not allowed. Any bobbles, bows, slides and hairbands should be plain and small, in our uniform colours where possible.

The School Day

The Department for Education has outlined their plans to ensure all schools provide 32 ¹/₂ hours of education per week as of September 2024. Many schools were able to secure these arrangements in readiness for September 2023. Due to the complexities involved in being split from Grindon Infant School, and my recent appointment, we have stalled these plans so we can consult with you all properly this year. I want to assess the school's access points, carefully consider traffic implications and we would also need to discuss with Nexus relating to the bus that they offer between both sites. **If you have any feedback on the current arrangements in place, I would welcome your views via the school email address.** The office staff will help me to collate your responses and contributions. We will write to you again later in the year to consult further, if required, and finalise our plans.

School Equipment

Water Bottles

All children require a water bottle in school. Please ensure that this is named/labelled. Children will be asked to bring this home with them each day for washing and re-filling.

Pencil Cases

Children have been provided with a school pencil case and all of the items that they will need to complete tasks. Pencil cases brought to school from home are often a distraction and is not something you need to purchase yourself.
