


This term, in Year 6, we will be reading...











Reading

In order to reinforce learning, your child will continue to bring home a reading record book. We would like to thank parents and carers who support their child when reading at home, as it is so important that children are reading regularly, hopefully for 10 - 15 minutes at least 5 times per week. It would be really helpful if you could listen to your child read and record this in their home reading record. Reading records are to be returned every **Monday** morning. Children will bring a book home from school, but they are also quite welcome to read any books or magazines they have at home. Our school is using the **Reading Plus** program to help your child become a better reader. Reading Plus sessions can also be recorded in the reading record book.

Homework Expectations at Broadway Junior School

Children will continue to receive homework **each Monday** to be returned the **following Monday**. Homework will be set using Sumdog or Times Tables Rock Stars (alternating each week). The work will be explained and discussed in class before coming home; it may be a continuation of classwork, or a task to consolidate learning. We would really appreciate your support in ensuring your child completes and returns their homework on time. Your child will continue to complete three sessions in school, but we encourage them to complete **two more Reading Plus assignments outside of school** on a computer or tablet with Internet access. This can contribute to their home reading recordings.

PE in Year 6

Children in Year 6 will participate in P.E. on **Tuesdays**. Your child will need to arrive in school wearing their kit. PE lessons will be taught by Mr Ramshaw our new SENDCo each week.

Our Curriculum in Year 6 this term...

In reading we will...

Focus on test technique, skimming and scanning, cool and uncool answers as well as strengthening our fluency and inference skills.

In writing we will...

Plan and write an extended narrative divided into chapters linked to the Titanic disaster. We will write an explanation using a range of presentational and organisational devices to structure the text and guide the reader. We will also present or recount information demonstrating appropriate language and feature choices.

In mathematics we will...

Study key concepts linked to area and perimeter, position and direction as well as statistics.

In science we will...

Know the main parts and functions of the human eye, understand how we see and become familiar with light sources. Understand how mirrors reflect light, angle of incidences and reflection, as well as the concept of refraction.

Describe how living things are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics and similarities and differences, including classifying micro-organisms, plants and animals.

In geography we will...

Understand that compass points can give specific directions & why maps use aerial perspectives. Explain the human features in a locality their change over time. Locate and identify both human and physical features. Calculate distance using scale. Grasp the concept of place and space.

In history we will...

Study Sunderland's changing industry: glass making, coal and shipbuilding. Focus on the River Wear and how it has met the demands of Sunderland, and continues to today. Compare Vaux brewery site with today's current redevelopment: the new city hall. Look at the impact Nissan had on the city and what the future may hold for Sunderland.

In art we will...

Describe the work and ideas of Pyrex (linked to local history) using appropriate vocabulary and referring to historical and cultural contexts. Create a piece of work in the style of Pyrex which reflects their own personality and evaluate.

In music we will...

Write, listen, review and perform a song for the Year 6 leavers' assembly.

In French we will...

Learn how to talk about our home and clothes using appropriate French vocabulary.

In D.T we will...

Explore different types of burgers, sauces and buns including their nutrition facts. Plan and cook a burger, evaluating the end result

In P.E we will...

Learn the rules of a variety of outdoor games in order to play them successfully and practise key skills related to the games. Build upon effective teamwork.

In PSHE/RSHE we will...

Exploring feelings and emotions and valuing differences. Answer: For Christians, what kind of king is Jesus? How does faith help people when life gets hard?

In computing we will...

Manage online information and continue to learn about internet safety.
