

This term, in Year 3, we will be reading...









Reading

In order to reinforce learning, your child will be given a reading record book. Reading is exceptionally important and it is imperative that children are reading regularly, hopefully for 10 - 15 minutes at least 5 times per week. It would be really helpful if you could listen to your child read and record this in their home reading record. Reading records are to be returned every **Monday** morning. Children will bring a book home from school, but they are also quite welcome to read any books or magazines they have at home.

Homework Expectations at Broadway Junior School

Children will receive homework each Monday to be completed by the following Monday. Homework will be set using the online platform Times Tables Rock Stars. The work will focus on the recall of times tables facts. The children will need to complete 10 garage games each week which will be equal to 10 minutes. Research has shown is more beneficial to complete 2 or 3 minutes over several days rather than 10 minutes all at once. We recommend downloading the free Times Tables Rock Stars App (TTRS). Your child will bring home their log in details. We would really appreciate your support in ensuring your child completes and returns their homework on time.

Spellings

In order for you to support your child at home, the children will receive a half termly spelling list. Spellings are tested every Friday.

PE in Year 3

Children in Year 3 will participate in P.E on **Wednesdays**, your child will need to arrive in school wearing their kit. PE lessons will take place inside and out, dependent on the weather so your child's choice of kit should reflect this. Trainers will be required for all pupils, with black tracksuit bottoms, shorts or joggers/leggings along with their regular uniform top (or white t-shirt).

Swimming lessons will take place for **Class 3JM** on a **Monday** and class **3LH** on a **Thursday**. The bus for swimming leaves promptly at 8:35am so please ensure your child arrives for 8:30am.

Explore a range of texts and the vocabulary used by the author to convey a character's thoughts and feelings. Study basic play scripts and identify features such as stage directions.

In writing we will...

Write character and setting descriptions using expanded noun phrases. Retell a familiar story. Begin to use inverted commas to show when someone is speaking. Write a non-chronological report linked to an area of our curriculum.

In mathematics we will...

Add and subtract numbers which bridge across 10. Count and compare numbers to 1,000 and add and subtract within 1,000 using known facts. Measure and read scales using mm/cm, g/kg and ml/l. Make simple conversions between measurements eg 250cm = 2m 50cm. Identify right angles in a range of shapes. Learn the 10 and 5 times tables.

In science we will...

Identify that animals, including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition. Identify that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement.

Observe how magnets attract or repel each other and attract some materials and identify some magnetic materials. Describe magnets as having 2 poles. Predict whether 2 magnets will attract or repel.

In history we will...

Look at Stone Age society, animals, housing, food and inventions. Consider land use and areas of settlements including shifting continents. Study inventions from the Stone Age to Iron Age in Ancient Britain.

In geography we will...

Study Rio and South East Brazil. We will learn the location and human/physical features of Rio de Janeiro and South-East Brazil, as a region in The Americas. Children will compare these new places with places they are familiar with.

In computing we will...

Learn to log onto our school computer system and access the online platforms that we use for homework such as Times Tables Rockstars, Sumdog and Purple Mash. We will develop coding skills and have the opportunity to explore program design.

In RE we will...

Explore the Christian creation story as well as learning about the Festivals of Harvest, Advent and Christmas.

In art we will...

Look at work by 'Alison Dearborn' and create replica cave drawings and rubbings using a range of different media. We will work with clay to produce leaf bowls.

In DT we will...

Investigate a range of packages used for different purposes. Design and make our own packaging using the skills of scoring, cutting, joining and strengthening.

In music we will...

Take part in weekly glockenspiel lessons with a music tutor learning basic rhythm and notation skills. Listen to and appraise a range of musical genres.

In PSHE/RSHE we will...

Learn how to keep ourselves safe near roads and online. Learn what to do in an emergency including some basic first aid skills. Learn how to look after our physical and mental health.
